The University of Texas at Austin's OnRamps dual enrollment program provides opportunities for high school students to earn college credit. OnRamps is designed to accelerate student success by providing university-level work and develop skills necessary for college. Students are able to experience college before college!

Why OnRamps?

- › **Convenience** OnRamps offers UT coursework within a high school classroom
- › **Transferable** OnRamps courses transfer to public colleges and universities in Texas and beyond
- › **Cost Effective** UT core courses at a significant discount for the same course taken on campus
- › **Preparation** Students gain early exposure, easing the transition from high school to college
- › **Access** Students are exempt from TSI requirements for OnRamps courses
- › **Low Risk** Students may drop the college enrollment at any time without penalty

How does OnRamps work?

Students are enrolled in a yearlong university-level learning experience taught by a UT-trained high school teacher on our high school campus. Students experience curriculum designed by faculty at The University of Texas at Austin. Students can earn three or six hours of UT credit, with feedback and assessment provided by UT course staff.

What courses does OnRamps offer?

- Rhetoric and Composition - English 1301 & 1302 (6 hours)
- US History- 1301 & 1302 (6 hours)
- Statistics - Math 1342 (3 hours)
- Algebra – Math 1314 (3 hours)
- Pre-calculus – Math 2312 (3 hours)
- Geoscience - GEO 1311 (3 hours)
- Chemistry – CH 301 & 104M & CH302 & 104N (8 hours)
- Physics 1301 & 1302 (8 hours)
- Biology 1306 (4 hours)
- Computer Science CS302 (3 hours)
