Grading System

One school year = 36 weeks
One semester = 18 weeks
Grading period = 9 weeks

Course grades for students are computed as follows for each nine-weeks period:

60%	Daily Work/Homework
40%	Major Grades/Assessments

Course grades for students are computed as follows for each semester:

42.5%	Each of the three six weeks
15%	Semester Exam

A grade of 70 on a 100-point scale is required to earn credit. The final yearly average determines credit.

90 - 100 = A

70 - 79 = C

80 - 89 = B

Below 70 is failing

GPA & Class Rank

Semester grades for all state credit courses will be averaged together to determine the student's grade point average and class rank. Courses designated as local credit will not be used in the calculation of GPA. Honors, AP, Dual Enrollment, and Dual Credit courses will have 5 extra points added to each semester grade for GPA purposes only and the extra points are not reflected on the report card or transcript.

GPA will be based and reported on a 100 point scale. GPA is a weighted average.

Average Student Ranking

The Median (middle) Grade Point Average for the 2021 Senior Class was 89.84 which ranked the average AHS student at 191 in a class of 382.

Students graduating in the top quarter of their class attained a GPA of 96.8 or higher.
